Social & cultural anthropology - understanding the world

The M.A. in social and cultural anthropology is a researchfocused master's program which offers you an advanced orientation in socio-cultural anthropology and guides you through an ethnographic research project.

At the heart of the program is the "guided research" component, in which you develop independent research projects in close conversation with both teaching staff and the other students in your cohort.

Both in your research projects and in accompanying courses, you engage with enduring and contemporary questions in the field of anthropology and learn to use ethnography as a reflexive lens on a particular research problem. This gives you the perfect prerequisites for pursuing an academic career and a head start compared to others who only study the theoretical methods.

Furthermore, the University of Bayreuth is well known for its focus on Africa in the humanities and arts which will give you the unique opportunity to spice up your curriculum with activities that also benefit your studies.

Studying at the cutting edge

Our program allows you to benefit from vast anthropological knowledge since the 5 chairs situated at our department focus on different research topics (e.g. activism and engagement, belonging and citizenship, bodies and intimacies, race and racism, gender and feminism, digital materialities, epistemologies of the Global South, global inequalities, infrastructures and technologies, heritage and authenticity, inequalities of care, lifeworlds in crisis, politics of kinship, etc.). Teaching will focus on recent debates in these fields.

Social and cultural anthropology in Bayreuth is also connected with the Cluster of Excellence "Africa Multiple" which is dedicated to reconfiguring African Studies through conceptual and structural interventions.

Take at least 2 courses. Possible options are language courses or courses in neighboring study programs such as M.A. Development Studies, M.A. Global History etc.	
Anthropology Lecture Series	7
Central discussion forum for anthropologists in Bayreuth and a place for intellectual exchange about recent debates.	
Master Thesis and Colloquium	25
The M.A. thesis (20 credits) is based on empirical or theoretical research conducted during your guided research project. The colloquium offers an opportunity to present your results to your fellow students and your supervisor.
